UAPs: Father General Arturo Sosa SJ has released the “UNIVERSAL APOSTOLIC PREFERENCES” (UAPs) on 19th March 2019 to guide and inspire the mission of the Society of Jesus in the coming ten years. It is the result of the worldwide Jesuits’ common discernment on the UAPs for almost two years. The UAPs were given to Pope Francis who prayed with them before returning them to Father General. Now the real journey for implementation begins. Each Jesuit, community, ministry, Province and Conference will discern how to implement these preferences and where God’s dream is taking them.

FATHER GENERAL VISITS INDIA:

Father General will be in India from 24th February to 9th March 2019 to participate in the Assembly of the Jesuit Conference of South Asia (JCSA) and then to visit the Provinces of Goa (GOA), Pune (PUN) and Bombay (BOM).

REGAE: Andhra Province had organized three REGAE programmes in Secunderabad in the months of October 2018 and January, February 2019 respectively. About 150 Jesuits from all the four Southern Provinces participated in the programme. All have expressed great satisfaction and experienced spiritual renewal. THE CAUSE OF BEATIFICATION OF FR PEDRO ARRUPPE:

The cause of beatification of Fr. Pedro Arrupe (1907 -1991), 28th Superior General of the Society of Jesus, was officially opened by the Vicariate of the Diocese of Rome on Tuesday, 5 February 2019. The opening ceremony was presided over by His Eminence Cardinal Angelo De Donatis, the Vicar General of the Diocese of Rome. He said Father Arrupe was firmly “rooted in Christ, whom he passionately loved and, with courageous faith, he

let himself be guided in his journey by the wisdom and freedom that comes from the Holy Spirit”
 “He was a true man of God” and a man of the Church as he sought to “integrate the best values from tradition with those necessary for adapting Christianity to new times” in accordance with the teachings of the Second Vatican Council, Cardinal de Donatis said. He was also “rich” in such treasured qualities as the ability to listen, understand, respect, help and trust others, teaching many how to become “men and women for others,” said the Cardinal.

A NEW BOOK BY FR. PAUL DOMINIC SJ

Jochebed, God of Ammas/Mammas (published by GSP in December 2018) is a medley of spirituality and psychology and familial love story, surrounding a woman born in 1918. Her name may be found nowhere in the annals except in her school records, as a student or teacher. Those sharing her centenary of birth, even if well known with biographies to their credit, for example, the Jesuit Cardinal Avery Dulles, Nelson Mandela, the classical dancer Mrinalini Sarabhai, the Father of the Guyanese nation, Cheddi Jagan, may not all be known everywhere, for example among the little known. The latter, for all their obscurity, have their own human story of love, laughter and loyalty in struggle, worth telling, representing 'full many a flower born to blush unseen and waste its sweetness in the desert air'. The book spreads that sweetness with the story of a mother, a working mother, a Jesuit mother, reminiscent of the mother in the novel *The Perfect Jesuit* by Furio Muncelli (Penguin Books, 2001).
