## OBITUARY

### FR. THOPPIL JOSEPH ALOYSIUS SJ (AND)



(13.01.1963 – 01.10.2019)

Fr. Aloysius Joseph Thoppil SJ was born on 13 January 1963 to Mr. Joseph Thoppil and Mrs. Alice Joseph at Chullimanonor, Kerala. He joined the Novitiate on 7 June 1988, studied philosophy at Satya Nilayam, Chennai in 1992-'94 and between 1997 - 2000 studied Theology at Vidyajyothi, Delhi. He was ordained on 29Dec, 2000 and in 2004 he completed his tertianship in Hazaribag.

He was a man of versatile personality who wore many hats in religious life; an all-rounder - pastor, educationist, pioneer, builder, minister, Director of hostels, Superior, Pastoral Coordinator, Consultor etc. - who loved to hold recreations and good humour with his legion of friends and acquaintances. He was rustic to the core, unchanged and relentless maverick. As Consultor, he demonstrated care and concern for the well-being of the members, institutions in the province and the Society of Jesus at large. He loved poor and stood for justice; He saw Christ in the poor and worked for their upliftment. In collaboration with many well-wishers he built concrete roof structures for the poor families of Bharathapuram, Narasanayanipalem of Vinukonda Mission.

renovated many churches too. He was a great lover of students, many students remember him for an extra mile he walked with them. He loved the Society and its members; all who know him are touched by his trust in divine providence, and strong faith in God.

In 2014 he fell sick and developed diabetes. He underwent treatment but was unsatisfactory. Later he regained his strength and was back to normal life with perfect health. He attributed this recovery to his visit to Our Lady of Health, Velangani, Tamil Nadu. We all die once, but he surprised even death. On 11 September 2019 he felt breathlessness and got admitted at St. Joseph's Hospital, Guntur. He almost felt he breathed his last and was gone. A team of three doctors attended and revived him after battling for a few hours. He shared this experience with awe and wonder but said he couldn't put it in words adequately. He believed this was a miracle in his life. In his journey towards death he witnessed Mother Mary inviting him. On 28 September night he was admitted at St. Joseph's Hospital, Guntur for breathlessness. He went into comatose stage and was suffering from multi organ failure due to hypoxia. He was kept under observation in ICCU. On 1 October around 10:55 am he breathed his last while a dozen Jesuits were praying for him. Fr. Provincial administered the Sacrament of the sick. What a blessed way and a blessed day to commend his soul to God, on the Feast day of St. Theresa of Child Jesus, Patroness of the Missions!
